The Chamber office was contacted by a company that offers self-service kayak and paddleboard rentals. It looks like an interesting opportunity and Chiara thought she'd see if anyone knows who might be interested in learning more. Chiara is also looking into information on becoming a Continental Divide Trail Gateway Community. The Continental Divide Trail Coalition just celebrated their one year anniversary. Greg suggested advertising to the hiking groups. One is called Trail Angles.

Chiara is attending several Safety Fest MT virtual education sessions all next week. This is offered free of charge by the Montana Department of Labor and Industry. She expects to gather information to share with our businesses. Chiara is also participating in a 3 day session to prepare for the Small Business Season. This event, Jingle all the way to the bank: Boosting Your Local Economy, offers 3 days of challenges.

Fall M.A.C.E. Conference in Helena. Chiara applied for and was awarded a \$250 Scholarship to help offset the cost of attending the conference. M.A.C.E. Stand for Montana Association of Chamber Executives. She continues to build strong relationships with Chamber Professionals from across the state.
